A father and his two songs had tended to the beacon of their lighthouse for many years. One night they trimmed the lights as usual, checked every detail, and

settled themselves for an evening of peace and quiet. Just before they retired, the eldest son made the rounds again and was perplexed to see no path of light flashing from the beacon. Then it was discovered that the

wind had carried millions of tiny insects which covered the glass so thickly that the light could not shine through. The men hurriedly cleaned the glass, but not in time, for morning disclosed a serious wreck had occurred early that evening on the rocks close to the shore. DOYOU REALLY WANT TO GO TO HEAVEN? - Jonnie Hutchison

If you have been around members of the Lord's church for long, you have probably heard someone say, "Heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people." This statement is true. Shortly before His death, Jesus said, "In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to **prepare** a place for you. And if I go and **prepare** a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also" (John 14:2-3). The lives we live on this earth have a very important purpose and that is to prepare ourselves to enter into the place Jesus has gone to prepare for us. That place is heaven. It is also described as everlasting or eternal life (Matthew 25:46; Titus 1:2). This purpose for our lives is clearly stated in the words, "Fear God and keep His commandments; for this is man's all" (Eccl. 12:13).

Jesus spoke the parable of the ten virgins to emphasize the necessity of being prepared. In the parable ten virgins came for a wedding and were waiting for the bridegroom to make his appearance. Five of the virgins wisely brought extra oil for their lamps, but five others foolishly failed to do so. When the lamps of the foolish virgins begin to go out, they tried to borrow oil from the other five, but were told to go and buy their own. While they were gone the bridegroom came and the five foolish virgins, being unprepared, were not allowed to enter for the door was shut. Jesus went on to end this parable with the words, "Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour in which the Son of Man is coming" (Matthew 25:1-13). A simple, yet vastly important lesson to be learned from this parable is, that unless you make adequate preparation before cause heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people.

Do you really want to go to heaven? If your sincere answer to this question is YES, then you will gladly follow the Lord's directions for making the proper preparation. You will submit in obedience to the gospel of Jesus Christ, believing that Jesus is the Son of God (John 8:24), turning from the practice of sin in repentance (Acts 17:30-31), confessing your faith in Jesus (Romans 10:9-10) and being immersed in water into the death of Jesus for the remission of your sins (Acts 2:38; Romans 6:3-4). Yet, that is only the beginning of preparing oneself for heaven. This preparation is a life-long expression of constant love for and continued faithfulness to the Lord.

If you really want to go to heaven you will do what is necessary to continued spiritual growth (Romans 10:17; 2 Peter 3:18). You will refuse to love the world or the things in the world and abstain from fleshly lusts (1 John 2:15-17; 1 Peter 2:11). You will walk in the light (1 John 1:7-9), let your light shine (Matthew 5:16) and follow the example Jesus has left us (1 Peter 2:21). When you sin, you will confess your sin, repent of it and seek God's forgiveness in prayer (Acts 8:22; 1 John 1:9). If you really want to go to heaven you will prepare yourself by being faithful to your spouse, a teacher and role model for your children and an active servant in the Lord's church (1 Cor. 6:18; Eph. 5:22-25; 6:1-2; Matt. 24:25-26).

Do you really want to go to heaven? If so, then your primary focus in life should be on making the proper preparation. If you have yet to prepare, please, do not put it off any longer. Remember, heaven is a prepared

the coming of the bridegroom (our Lord) you any longer. Remember, heaven is a prepared place for a prepared people.
