CURSING—A MISUSE OF THE TONGUE By Jonnie Hutchison

Is it really all that important as to what words come out of our mouths? Jesus said it was. Listen carefully to the words of the Son of God: "For by your words you will be justified, and by your words vou will be demned" (Matthew 12:37). That suggests the seriousness with which we should view what we say and how we say it.

Cursing and using the name of God in vain is so common in our day that even very small children do it. Worldly minded parents care not that their small children imitate their use of words that condemn even considering it to be "cute." How sad! The media television, movies, and print—often contain profanity— even movies and books directed toward children. Sadly our society seems to be permeated by use of profanity.

We may expect those who are not Christians to use words that cause condemnation. But those of us who are Christians should never use curse words, profanity, or their equivalent euphemisms (a milder form of the word

with the same meaning). For example, while many Christians would never use the phrase "my God" as an exclamation of surprise they will instead use the equivalent euphemisms such as "gosh" or "by golly." Just as is true with the common curse words, the use of these milder forms becomes a habit and most seem to be unaware just how often they use them. It is a hard habit to break but it can be done. It is a matter of thinking about what we say before we say it and being aware of how the words we speak will impact ourselves and others.

The Christian who curses men and then praises God is a hypocrite. Inspiration declares concerning the improper use of the tongue, "With it we bless our God and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the similitude of God. Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so" (James 3:9-10). No Christian should be using profanity under any circumstance! It is foreign to the very spirit of Christ and will result in one's condemnation unless there is genuine repentance.

version today (Mk. 16:15-16; Heb. 4:12).

While there is no conversion without the Holy Spirit, there is no operation of the Holy Spirit in conversion independent of God's Word. Often the same things are ascribed to the Word in conversion that are attributed to the Holy Spirit's work in conversion. Notice several things that are said to be done by the Holy Spirit and the Word in conversion:

- 1. ENLIGHTENS. "The commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes" (Psa. 19:8).
- 2. CONVERTS. "The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul" (Psa. 19:7).
- 3. GIVES LIGHT. "The entrance of thy words giveth light" (Psa. 119:130).
- 4. GIVES UNDERSTANDING. "Through thy precepts I get understanding" (Psa. 119:104).

- 5. SAVES. "Receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls" (Jas. 1:21).
- 6. PURIFIES. "Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit" (I Pet. 1:22).
- 7. PRODUCES FAITH. "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom. 10:17).
- 8. IS SPIRIT AND LIFE. "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life" (Jn. 6:63).
- 9. JUDGES US. "The word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day" (Jn. 12:48).

From these and other verses of the New Testament, we conclude that the Holy Spirit uses His Word to convert the souls of men today.

LEFT BEHIND

What is the greatest thing you could leave behind when you die? Some will say it is the gift of love. Showing your family members what it means to love and encourage them to show that love to one another. Others might say that the greatest thing we can leave behind is faith. Demonstrating to your family what it means to trust in God and encouraging them to also live by faith also.

Love and faith are certainly important things to leave behind but I think there is something else of equal perhaps greater value that we can leave behind and that is hope.

When you depart from this life you will be separated from those you love. You will not see them anymore in this life and they will not see you. During that period of absence brought on by death is there anything more wonderful to give your love ones than hope? The hope to see each other again. The expectation that because you live your life by faith and love in God you will see those you left behind again.

This was the point of Paul's message to the Thessalonians in 1 Thess 4.13-18, "But I do not want you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning those who have fallen asleep, lest you sorrow as others who have no hope. For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who sleep in Jesus. For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain

until the coming of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep. For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of an archangel, and with the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And thus we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore comfort one another with these words."

Paul tells the saints of Thessalonica that they don't have to leave with the absence of hope. But with the expectation that we will see those who have died and went on before us again. That we will be united in eternal spiritual bodies and never be separated again.

Can you think of people you have lost wherein you anticipate that great day of reunion with hope? I sure can.


