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lives. We wonder how they actually view the activities they miss. Are they just optional matters? Are they pointless activities designed to take up the time of members? Are they simply things that are designed to make individuals feel guilty for not attending? If the answer to these questions is not, "No," then how do you view the worship services, the Bible classes, the activities that you miss? What purpose are they supposed to serve? Too, if they do serve an important purpose, is that purpose supposed to include you?

Attending the programs of the church involves a mindset. Failing to attend the programs of the church also involves a mindset. Do you yearn for the things of the world? or, do you long for things above? Are you more concerned about your individual matters? or, are you more concerned about the body of Christ, the church? Do you believe that the here-and-now is the most important consideration? or, is the most important consideration the world to come? Is your focus on pleasing other human beings? or, is your focus upon pleasing the Christ?

Dear Christians, we sing a multitude of hymns to these ends? "O to Be Like Thee," "All to Jesus I Surrender," "None of Self and All of Thee," "Have Thine Own Way, Lord," "I Am Resolved," "I Am Thine, O Lord," "I Want to Be A Worker for the Lord," "Jesus Is All the World to Me," "Let Him Have His Way with Thee," "Let Me Live Close to Thee," "Let the Beauty of Jesus Be Seen," "Living for Jesus," "More about Jesus," "Take My Life, and Let It Be," "This World Is Not My Home," "To the Work," "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes," "Where He Leads, I'll Follow," "Without Him," "Worthy Art Thou," "Work, for the Night Is Coming," "He Is My Everything," "I Am Crucified with Christ," "Seek Ye First," and "I Am Mine No More" are all songs we sing on a regular basis. Do we mean the words of these songs when we sing them? Or, do we simply mouth the words?

When individuals read an article like this, they will shout out, saying: "Love, grace, and mercy." In essence, they seem to believe that God's love, mercy, and grace will cover their intentional lack of service to the Master. Those who shout these things do not understand love, mercy, or grace. Let's consider grace for a moment. It is true that the purpose of grace is to cover sin ([Rom. 5:20](#)). How-

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ever, this grace is not supposed to be used as a license to transgress God's Word. "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound? God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?" ([Rom. 6:1-2](#)). According to Jude, it is possible for an individual to turn the grace of God into lasciviousness" ([Jude 4](#)). Grace was not intended to cover those who want to do less. Grace was intended to motivate Christians to do more. We learn this from the example of Paul. In 1 Corinthians 15:10, he reveals his response to God's grace. "But by the grace of God I am what I am; and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me." Love and mercy are similar in nature. They are not simply escape routes for the unfaithful. They are motivators given to God's children to help ensure that they continue to walk in the light.

2026 is here. This is the second Sunday of this New Year. May each of us examine ourselves to see whether we are in the faith ([2 Cor. 13:5](#)). Let's renew our hearts for the Lord. Let's fill them with love and thanksgiving that motivates us to obey, worship, and serve our Lord with fervor. Let's divorce ourselves from the world. Let's commit to living for Jesus to the utmost of our ability. Let's be like Paul and commit to this simple statement: "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" ([Phil. 1:21](#)). —Oceanside church of Christ FL.


