IT'S A MATTER OF BIBLE AUTHORITY

When the inspired Paul wrote to the church of Christ in Colosea he imparted this divine directive, “*And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him*” (Colossians 3:17). Doing anything “in the name of the Lord Jesus” requires His prior permission. For example, the Lord has not given His permission to substitute for the elements of the Lord’s Supper. Therefore, we do not have His authority to substitute yeast roles or grape soda for the unleavened bread and grape juice. To do so would be a direct violation of Colossians 3:17 and other passages (Gal. 1:6-9; Rev. 22:18-19).

What about religious holy days? Where has the Lord given us permission to celebrate the birth of Jesus on December 25th as a religious holy day? Some would argue, what could possibly be wrong with doing so, after all, “we should be thankful that Jesus Christ is being honored and His name exalted.” What could possibly be wrong in that? Yet, the question must be asked can

we honor Christ and exalt His name by acting without His permission or authority? Where has He commanded us to observe “Christmas” as a religious holy day? Where is the book, chapter and verse that gives us permission to say, “Jesus is the reason for the season?” Where is the example of the New Testament church keeping the day of His birth as a special religious celebration?

The Lord authorizes (gives His permission) through His Word and only through His Word. The Holy Spirit inspired the apostle Peter to write, “*If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God*” (1 Peter 4:11). Can one speak as the oracles of God while claiming “Christmas” as a religious holy day?

While the events surrounding the birth of Jesus are vitally important in proving His Deity, our Lord has not given us permission to make the day of His birth (which date he has not revealed to us) a religious holy day. However, He has given us His permission (by way of command and

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example) to remember the day of **His death** in partaking of the Lord's Supper **each first day of the week**. We have His permission as given in Matthew 26:26-29 where Jesus, "took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. 29 But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom." The Father's kingdom is the church of Christ. We have His permission by example as the church in Troas assembled on the first day of the week "to break bread" (Acts 20:7).

We have Jesus' permission in what Paul wrote to the Corinthian church giving the church permission to come together in the assembly to partake of the Lord's supper and thereby remember and proclaim the death of Jesus until He comes again (1 Corinthians 11:20-26). Yes, we are authorized to assemble on the first day of each week to worship in remembering the death of Jesus but this is the only "holy day" this side of the cross which the Lord has given His permission and command to keep.

Yes, it's a matter of the Lord's authority. Either we submit to it or suffer the eternal consequences for rejecting it. Remember, **"whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name (by the authority or permission) of the Lord Jesus!**

TIS THE SEASON *By Randy Shouse*

We are rapidly approaching the time of year when many of our friends and the world in general thinks about Jesus. In particular, the baby Jesus. Nativity scenes are displayed, special services are held, and we see the billboards proclaiming, "Jesus is the reason for the season". How do we respond to this? What do we say when we are asked about our "special" Christmas services? Let's look at this from a Bible prospective.

It must be understood that nowhere in the Bible does God give us any definitive date for Jesus' birth. Only two of the four gospels even mention his birth (Matthew and Luke). We are told that He would be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2), of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14) and that was during the reign of Roman emperor Augustus Caesar (Luke 2:1). Other than that, we are given no time of year or even the year itself. This should tell us that the actual day is not that important. We have already been given "everything pertaining to life and godli-

ness" (2 Peter 1:2).

Contrast this with the death and resurrection of which we are told the time (Passover) and the day (1st day of the week). We also note that the early church, led by the inspired Apostles met on the first day of the week (Acts 20:7) to worship. Nowhere in the Bible do we ever read about any special celebration for Jesus' birth.

So, what does the birth of Jesus mean to us? It is the fulfillment of God's promise to man to send a savior (Romans 8:3, Ephesians 2:4-8). It means the delivery of God's word to mankind (Hebrews 1:2, John 1:14). It opened the door to salvation for us (Romans 16:25-27).

Someone may ask, "what does it hurt to pick out a special day to celebrate Jesus' birth?" God has given us instruction on how to worship him. He has set out a pattern (Hebrews 8:5, 2 Peter 3:1). It includes sing-

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ing, praying, observing the communion, giving and teaching. If we add to this "special days" are we not telling God that we think we have a better way than He has given us? Jesus cautions us to "do the will of the father" (Matthew 7:21-23). Paul warned us about "self-made" religion (Colossians 2:20-23).

Let's instead use the opportunity to talk to people about Jesus and God. It is one of the few times when lots of people even think about Jesus. Invite them to a service, engage them in a Bible study, tell them the real way to celebrate Jesus' birth is by taking advantage of His sacrifice by becoming a Christian and have Him make a difference in our lives each day of the year.
