HOW IS YOUR INFLUENCE?

There is no doubt that each of us influence those around us by what we say and by what we do. The truth is that we can neither help it nor avoid it—that's the power of influence.

In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus compared human influence to both salt and light. "You are

the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. You are the light of the


world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16 NKJV).

Think about the power of salt to influence whatever it touches. Salt has been used as a preservative for years. When salt is put on for darkness is the absence of food it flavors it. Without the in-

fluence of salt many foods are bland and unappetizing. On the other hand, excessive amounts of salt not only can ruin the taste of food but may also raise blood pressure and negatively impact ones health. So the influence of salt may be either good or bad.

Since Jesus says that His dis-

ciples are the "salt of the earth" it follows that He expects us to exert a good and positive influence upon those around us. In writing to Timothy the inspired Apostle admonished, "Let no


light. Jesus commands us, not to hide our lights, but to let the light of our influence for good shine before men. In other words, we must let the light of our influence dispel the darkness of sin in the world. Exerting a good influence in our lives glorifies, that is, magnifies and brings honor, to God. Inspiration uses a phrase in Galatians 2:20 that suggests this type of influence. "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, **but Christ lives in me**; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." To let "Christ live in me" is equivalent to living "by faith in the Son of God." To put it simply, when one follows the teaching of the Bible in his/her life then that person is allowing Christ to live in him/her for that person is living by faith (Romans 10:17; 4:12; 2 Corinthians 5:7).

Consider the matter of parental influence. As parents we are given the instruction to bring our children up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord (Ephesians 6:4). Whether we exert the proper influence over our children will go along way in determining their eternal destiny. If we are willing to sacrifice our time and effort in teaching them the Word of God in the home and in seeing that they attend Bible classes and worship then we can expect positive results (Proverbs 22:6). If we fail to set the proper example of love and faithfulness to God in our lives our children will see that and be influenced

away from God. In other words by our influence we can either encourage their salvation or contribute to their being lost. It is YOUR choice as a parent.

Consider the matter of influencing the lost. The lost with whom we come in contact day by day hear what we say and see what we do. They base their conclusions about New Testament Christianity and whether it appeals to them upon what they see in our lives. If they see a faithful Christian they have a positive view of original Christianity. If they see an unfaithful Christian they are influenced in the opposite direction. It is impossible to encourage others to listen to the truth if you are not living it in your own life. A bad influence cannot be hidden any more than a good influence. It is YOUR choice as a Christian as to whether or not you exert an influence that will lead to the salvation of the lost.

What kind of influence are you exerting by the life you are now living? Exerting the right kind of influence in the world is directly related to the strength of ones love and faith in God. One who truly loves God will show it in his life by his continued submission to the will of God. One who truly believes God and trusts Him will have no problem with letting his light shine in such a way as to glorify his God. In humility and with the deepest sense of responsibility and accountability, "let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven!"
