I suppose that each of us would like to believe that the life we are each living has real meaning. That whatever we accomplish in life is beneficial to others and that others see and appreciate our contribution to society no matter how large or small it may be.

When God created man and placed him in the garden of Eden he commanded him to "dress it and keep it" (Gen. 2:15). God expected man to accomplish something worthwhile and meaningful with his life. He also gave man instructions regarding a certain tree in the garden—the tree of the knowledge of good and evil—commanding him not to partake of its fruit (Gen. 2:16-17). It's obvious that God desired man to use his life to follow God's will for man's own good. Sadly, man chose not to obey God's command and suffered the conse-

quences. Whatever man had accomplished to that point in dressing and keeping the garden was meaningless because part of his punishment for choosing to disobey God was separation from the garden (Gen. 3:23-24).

Does a life lived without God have any lasting meaning? Consider the record of the rich man in Luke 16:19ff. Here was a man who wore the best and most expensive clothing and who "faired sumptuously every day." He had everything he needed and more but he lived his life without God. We are not told of all his accomplishments in life. We do not know all that he contributed to his society. He may have accomplished many great things in the eyes of his fellowman. What we do know is that he died and was buried and found himself in torments in

hades. At that point what did his previous life mean to him? Of what value to him was his wealth and accomplishments in his life? There are only two things mentioned that greatly concerned this rich man in hades. First, he asked for Abraham to send the beggar Lazarus to dip his finger in water so that he could cool his tormented tongue. Second, he expressed his concern for his brothers who were still living asking Abraham to send Lazarus back from the dead to warn them to change their lives so that they might not come to where the rich man was. Neither of these requests could be fulfilled. The fact is that without God, the rich man's life and accomplishments were ultimately meaningless for he lived his life without God.

What about your life dear reader? Are you living your life without God? If so, then whatever you may be accomplishing in your life is ultimately meaningless for you will find yourself in the same position as the rich man who lifted up his eyes being in torment.

Only submission to God will give your life real and lasting meaning. The Bible puts it this way in Ecclesiastes 12:13-14, "Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and keep His commandments, For this is man's all, For God will bring every work into judgment, Including every secret thing, Whether good or evil."
