WHAT DO YOU THINK? By Jonnie Hutchison

God has given us the ability to think, reason and made decisions. This is a part of being made in His image and likeness and being free moral agents (Genesis 1:26). Many different things in life impact the way one thinks. One's thoughts can be either good or bad. Sin can occupy one's thoughts or, one's thoughts can be directed by the teaching of God's word. We each decide the direction of our thoughts.

The Bible teaches that what one thinks is an indication of his character. Proverbs 23:7a reads, "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he." In other words, one's thoughts govern one's actions. Jesus said, "A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the

heart his mouth speaks." (Luke 6:45). The "heart" in this passage refers to the place where one's thoughts are generated, not to the organ that pumps blood. One's mind can generate good thoughts that produce good actions, or evil thoughts that produce evil actions.

The truth is that each of us are ultimately in control of what we think. Consider what Paul wrote to Christians in 2 Corinthians 10:5, "casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ." The church in Philippi was instructed to think on things that were true, noble, just, pure, lovely, of good report, of virtue and praiseworthy (Phil. 4:8). This indicates that one can choose and control his or her thoughts.

Paul to write to Christians in Colossians 3:1-2, "If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth." Yes, what do you think?

ARE YOU A "CHURCH OF CHRIST?" By Tim Kidwell

Here is the scenario: A group of friends are discussing religion and someone asks, "What are you?" To this question some say, "I am a Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian, Catholic, etc." And then you are asked the same question. How would you respond? If you say that you are "Church of Christ," or some similar phrase, then, you have answered incorrectly.

Some may defend their response by claiming they are only using accommodative language to help their friends understand. Such terminology denominationalizes the Lord's church. His church is not a denomination. Denomination means there is more than one under consideration. The Bible plainly teaches that there is only one body (Eph. 4:4), and that the body is the same thing as the church (Eph. 1:22-23). Jesus only said He

would build one church (Mat. 16:18).

Then what is the correct answer to the question, "What are you religiously?" You are a Christian. Not a "Church of Christ" Christian, but simply, a New Testament Christian. By becoming a child of God as the Bible teaches you were added to the church that belongs to Christ, or, the church of Christ (Acts 2:47).

Take advantage of these opportunities to use language that sets the true church apart from the rest of the religious world. These moments are great teaching opportunities. Your religious friends believe that one church is as good as another. That is why they have no problem attending a denomination. That is why they have no problem using denominational terms. Most will even refer to their reli-

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
